

# PAST PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Then I took the oath of office last January, I had many goals, but one in particular: To increase diversity in our chapter. I am proud to report that in the course of one year, ABOTA-OC approved eleven new members. Of that eleven, six are women, two are Hispanic and their average age is 41. When you consider that the average age of

National ABOTA member is 68, this is a major accomplishment and I am excited to have been a part of it.

We have accomplished so much more. During the 2023-2024 school year, 670 elementary and junior high school students traveled to the Mendez Tribute Park in Westminster, courtesy of OC ABOTA. Our chapter members not only traveled to the Mendez Tribute Park to personally speak to the students, our chapter financed the cost of bussing the children and their teachers to the Park. Thanks to our fundraising efforts, these children now know about the important case of Mendez v. City of Westminster, and the impact it had on ethnic equality in schools. Recently, Governor Newsom signed a law, making classroom instruction on the Mendez case a required part of California school curriculum. A special thank you to Mike Maguire for all of his hard work on this project.

In addition to educating our youth, we have been actively teaching civics, via our Civility Matters programs to lawyers. Traditionally, these seminars were given only to lawyer groups and law firms, but over the past two to three years, we have branched out to High School students and Law Schools. What better way to ingrain civility and professionalism in the minds of



our future lawyers and citizens than this? Thank you to all who assisted in this, particularly Deb Tropp and Jeff Roberts.

Through the course of my presidency in 2024 I traveled with ABOTA to Biloxi, Seattle, Greece, Sicily, Nashville, Hawaii and Dallas. I was at the National Board meeting in Nashville, when ABOTA approved a change to the membership bylaws, allowing applications with 7 jury

trials, and 100 points to apply for membership. This national board meeting was especially exciting. A rigorous and healthy discussion took place before the vote and concerns over relaxing the admission requirements were addressed. The amendment passed with only one dissent. We have already received several nominations for membership due to the new bylaws. I am confident this new change will revitalize our organization and keep its members young and our numbers growing.

My journey with ABOTA leadership does not end here. I will continue my work as a Trustee for the National Foundation, and will be sworn in as Treasurer of the Foundation in January at the National meeting in Cabo. The foundation is the educational arm of ABOTA, and I will work hard to raise funds for our many educational programs that occur throughout all of the chapters in the country. Civics education is the heart of our organization, and a great passion of mine and I am excited to get to work.

Finally, I want to congratulate Juan Delgado, our 2025 incoming President. I know he will work hard to continue to lead this great chapter of ours. Thank you to everyone, for letting me lead this group in 2024. It's been the honor of a lifetime for me.

ike has been a deeply committed leader and advocate of ABOTA's mission since his admission in 1994.

Beginning his career as a
Deputy DA in the Orange County
District Attorney's office, Mike tried

first Special Victims Unit. There, he


